

Important Waiver Information

The Living at Home Waiver Program has filled all available waiver slots and is closed to persons with disabilities who live in their home in the community.

Medicaid's Home and Community Based Services waivers are limited by enrollment caps and budget allocations. The Living at Home Waiver Program has reached its limit.

The State has initiated a Waiver Services Registry for individuals

living in their home, in the community who are interested in receiving waiver services, when additional slots and funding becomes available. To add your name to the Waiver Services Registry, please call (toll free) 1-866-417-3480. Once your name is on the Registry, the State will notify you if slots and funding becomes available.

Questions & Answers About the Living at Home Waiver Program

What is the Living at Home Waiver Program?

- The Living at Home Waiver Program provides community services and supports to enable people with physical disabilities to live in their own home.

What are the eligibility requirements for waiver services?

- When waiver slots are available, individuals must meet medical, financial, and technical guidelines to be eligible for LAH waiver services. Such as:
 - Medical: The person must meet Nursing Home Level of Care.
 - Financial: Monthly income of a person may not exceed 300% of SSI benefits (\$1,869 monthly in 2007) and the countable assets may not exceed \$2,000. Only the income and assets of the person (and assets of any spouse) are considered in determining financial eligibility.
 - Technical: Maryland residents between the age of 18 – 59.
